Description of the Temple Bridge Diversion From Hurley Lock walking towards Marlow

From Hurley, continue on the Thames Path past Hurley Lock **Pic A**, over a footbridge and continue beside the river.

Go through a gate and past woodland on your right. Look for close-boarded fence on the right and take the Public Footpath alongside it to the end of the path **Pic B**.

Turn left onto a Public Footpath, go through a gate and onto a track which soon becomes asphalt. Follow this road past fences and brick walls on the left and fields on the right.



Where the road goes off to the right **Pic C**, the Thames Path diversion follows the Public Footpath on the left into a short tunnel.

Continue on the Footpath to a gate with houses on the left and cars parked close by. **Pic D.** This is Temple Lane.

Continue on Temple Lane, taking care when crossing Bradenham Lane that comes in from the right. You will be walking on a narrow road with no pavement, so please take care, use a torch if you're walking at night.



Continue along Temple Lane, past
Marlow Sailing Club. Walk on the
outside of the sharp bends, one to the
right and the next to the left. **Pic E**Temple Lane joins Marlow Road at
Bisham, close to the entrance of the
Bisham Abbey National Sports Centre.

Here there is a narrow pavement through the village of Bisham and on to Marlow.



As you approach
Marlow Bridge Pic F
stay on the left side
of the road. Cross
the bridge and then
cross the road at
the bollards Pic G.



Turn left and walk beside the churchyard fence. Turn right at the red brick pillar and continue to the fingerpost **Pic H** at the entrance to the churchyard. This is where you rejoin the Thames Path and walk towards Bourne End.
