Description of the Temple Bridge Diversion From Marlow walking towards Hurley Lock



As you come out of the churchyard at Marlow, **Pic I**, turn left at the red brick pillar and cross the road at the bollards **Pic J**.





Walk across
Marlow Bridge
on the right side
of the bridge Pic
K, and onto
Bisham Road Pic





Stay on the pavement through the village of Bisham and fork right **Pic M** onto Temple Lane, which is just past the entrance of the Bisham Abbey National Sports Centre.

THAMES PATH

NATIONAL TRAIL

Temple Lane is a narrow road with no pavement. Please take care and walk on the outside of the sharp bends, one to the right and the next to the left. Use a torch if you're walking at night. Continue past Marlow Sailing Club and houses in Temple Lane. **Pic N.**




The Thames Path diversion is on a Public Footpath beyond Stable Cottages, the gate onto the footpath is obscured behind vehicles in the photo. **Pic O and P**







Pic Q and follow the road with brick wall or fences on the right and fields on the left. The asphalt surface becomes a rough track. Go through the gate and take the Public Footpath to the right. Pic R and S.





Walk along this Footpath to re-join the Thames Path. Turn left and walk towards Hurley Lock.
